How to Use the Share It! Cambridge English Maps

The Share It! Cambridge English maps show where language that is in the Cambridge English exams syllabus is taught in the course. There is a map for Vocabulary, organized by topic, and a map for Grammar, organized by structure.

Teachers should note that there are instances in Share It! where the US form of a UK word (e.g. "cabinet" for "cupboard") is not included in the Starters syllabus and so children preparing to take the Starters exam should be taught the equivalent UK form of some words.
